

In the mailbox Greg Jones noted that Model A Ford Foundation Inc. (MAFFI) had solicited a donation to the Model A Ford Museum at the Gilmore Museum in Hickory Corners, MI. - December 13 & 14 Sage Valley Currier & Ives Christmas


May 2020 – Tour and Picnic at Rivers Bridge State Park

Oh, those "Ahooga horns": How does your horn sound? It should be long, loud, and have a nice "ahooga" sound! If you say yours sounds more like a sick cow, it might just be time to do something about it!



Sometimes, all it will take is properly oiling and adjusting the tension screw. Try this first. If you still don't get a good sound, it's time to take it off, take it apart, and clean or repair it! This is not a difficult job, and is a great entry level task for working on a small motor.

An ahooga horn is a fairly simple design. A small motor turns a ratcheted wheel against a thin metal diaphragm. Sometimes one of these two parts needs to be replaced. The brushes on the motor can also be dirty or worn and need replaced. All major Model A suppliers sell parts, or you can buy a complete rebuild kit with all the parts included.

If you have copies of the "Model A Mechanics" Handbooks by Les Andrews, there is a great step by step tutorial to follow. Also, just do a little searching on youtube, and there are some great videos to watch for guidance. Remember, a great sounding horn is more than just fun, it's a necessity for safety too!

**ABOUT HEADLIGHTS: I found two headlight lenses in Bratton's catalog. (The word "Bratton's" does not appear on the actual lenses!)



This lens (L) was used on 1928 vehicles. It had vertical lines only; they're known as flutes. The headlamp bulbs are dualfilament for "bright" and "dim".



From 1929 on, headlights now bore the name TWO-LITE, and were furnished with a two-bulb reflector. A 15 candle-power bulb provided the parking light, and a dual-filament 32-32 cp bulb was the driving light. The Ford script

appeared in the bottom of the lens, and the lens pattern had been changed, possibly to produce a better beam.
